

## **Progress and Results to Date**

## **Cumulative highlights**

- 28 countries adopted NS/APs
- 45 countries developed NFMS
- 29 countries supported on FRELs
- 36 countries supported with their approaches to meeting safeguards requirements



## **Progress and Results to Date**

## 2019 highlights

- NS/AP: Bangladesh, Honduras, Mongolia
- FRELs: Argentina, Bangladesh, Nigeria, Solomon Islands + Colombia, Ecuador, Honduras, Kenya, Mexico (early 2020)
- SIS and summaries of information doubled
- NDC review process
- Gender: 14 countries; Myanmar doubled
- LCIP Platform: inception process with UNFCCC
- Shifting to implementation: Chile, Colombia, Congo, Indonesia, Myanmar

## COVID-19

- 2021 transition year
- Assessing impact on delivery of 2020 workplan
- Launch scoping process for 2021
- Deepen resource mobilisation efforts

- 2021: Transition year




# **UN-REDD post-2020 Strategic Framework**

## **RESULTS FRAMEWORK 2021-2025**

# OUTCOME 1 – FOREST SOLUTIONS REALISED

Forest-based GHG emission reductions and enhanced removals, of increasing quality, achieved at a level of 1 GtCO2e

- 1.1 REDD+ investment plans/programmes
- 1.2 Forest landscape restoration
- 1.3 Deforestation-free commodity supply chains
- 1.4 Monitoring systems for highquality and accurate emission data
- 1.5 Safeguards addressed and reported

# OUTCOME 2 – FOREST SOLUTIONS REWARDED

USD 5bn mobilised for REDD+ from RBP schemes, carbon markets and other transactions under Art. 6 of the Paris Agreement

- 2.1 RBP for REDD+ results
- 2.2 Market transactions
- 2.3 Private-sector forest carbon investments

# OUTCOME 3 – FOREST SOLUTIONS ENHANCED

More than 15 countries enhance significantly the forest component of their NDCs in the 2020-2025 cycle

3.1 NDCs mitigation actions in the forest and land-use sectors

# OUTCOME 4 – CONNECTING ACTORS & KNOWLEDGE FOR FOREST SOLUTIONS

A global, transformative NBS movement accelerates climate action

- 4.1 Knowledge on how to scale up REDD+ implementation
- 4.2 Collective political and societal support to NBS
- 4.3 Digital cooperation and frontier technologies

## **Resource Mobilisation**

- Positive signals for forest agenda
- Engagement with current and new donors
- Entry points:
  - COP 26 in Glasgow in November
  - EU MFF 2021-27: EUR 80b for external actions
  - UK: ICF doubled for next 5 year to GBP 11.3b
- RM strategy in next 18 months

- Updated Strategic framework end of July
- Circulate 2019 AR
- 2021 Workplan and Budget as soon as funds confirmed
- Resource mobilisation strategy end of July
- 2021 WP scoping exercise next 6 months
- Board meeting by end of 2020
- 2021 transition year, continuing co-design and roll out of next phase
