Key Facts about the UN-REDD LMR Initiative

- Total Budget US\$ 8.3M
- Government of Norway NICFI grant
- FAO/UNEP collaboration integrated into the existing UN-REDD Programme framework
- Initial 2-year phase 2020-21, 5-year vision
- Implemented in 5 LMR countries and China
- One international coordinator + country coordinator / admin assistant
- Project approved in March 2020 -> 6 months inception phase
- Ongoing country consultations on workplan



UN-REDD LMR Initiative Theory of Change

 Working to increase national commitment to legal and sustainable trade and investment in wood products across the Lower Mekong Region and China

• The Initiative will support the development of national standards, systems and capacities for enhancing the scope for verifiably legal and sustainably produced timber products, and associated reduction of proportion of illegal and unsustainable products in regional and international value chains

• Maintain the importance of sustainability and legality in forest product trade in the recovery period after COVID-19

UN-REDD LMR Initiative Theory of Change

• 1 regional and 2 national Outcomes

Overall impact: The overall impact of the project will be to reduce forest degradation and deforestation and promote sustainable management of forests across the LMR. This will ultimately lead to reduced GHG emissions

Project goal: The goal of this project is to increase national commitment to legal and sustainable trade and investment in wood products across the LMR (and China)

Outcome 1: Strengthened bilateral and regional cooperation in place to facilitate legal and sustainable trade in forest products across the LMR (and China)

Outcome 2: Improved forest governance for legal and sustainable trade of forest related products

Outcome 3: Improved monitoring of forest and land use through enhanced data accessibility and management

Outputs

- 1.1 Dialogue and cooperation on tackling illegal logging enhanced, through bilateral and regional platforms
- 1.2 Intra-regional cooperation deepened, to promote SFM across the region
- 1.3 Platform established to encourage responsible investment in the forest sector
- 1.4 Dialogue between China and LMR deepened, to enhance cooperation on supply of sustainable wood products
 - 1.5 Bilateral and regional data-sharing for transboundary cooperation strengthened
- 1.6 Communications campaigns developed to raise public awareness on forest crime and incite behavior change

Outputs

- 2.1 National activities implemented to support cooperation commitments2.2 National certification standards strengthened across LMR countries
- 2.3 Systems and instruments strengthened to verify, track and license legality and sustainability of timber
- 2.4 Capacities of national institutions on forest governance, SFM and trade built2.5 Viable forest production models identified, to supply sustainable timber

Outputs

- 3.1 Near real-time monitoring system for deforestation and degradation developed and tested

- 3.3 Systems strengthened for tracking environmental and social impacts



Problem Statement:

The major growth in the export of wood products from the region has catalysed forest crime and illegal logging, moving from countries of high forest cover (Lao PDR, Cambodia and Mynamar) to exporting hubs (in particular Vietnam and China). In order to reverse this trend it is necessary to enhance legal and sustainable trade in wood products across the region.

	2.5 Viable forest production models identified, for supply of sustainable timber
	2.6 Community-based groups and smallholders enabled to access legal and sustainable forest product value chains
	2.7 Key recommendations and actions agreed by key stakeholders, to scale up actions to tackle illegal and extra-legal conversion of forestland to other land uses.

- ASEAN Facilitate LMR country focal points to ASEAN Senior Officers Forestry (ASOF) and associated WGs to implement ASEAN decisions
- China Engagement of Chinese forest product industry in association with ITTO-led Global Green Supply Chain and FAO FLEGT and SW4SW initiatives
- Finance Work with capital providers to direct investment towards sustainable practices, and support community-led enterprises,
 SMEs to access legal, sustainable value chains
