**9. Brief summary of the mission**

*9.a Context*

Honduras, a partner country of the [UN-REDD Programme](#) since 2010 was invited by the Policy Board (PB) to present a submission for a National Programme (NP) at PB13 (November 2014). Honduras is also a participant country of the Forest Carbon Partnership Facility ([FCPF](#)) since 2009, and the country has agreed to work with UNDP as the delivery partner of the World Bank's FCPF in their REDD+ readiness process. FCPF's participants committee has endorsed Honduras' [RPP](#) in 2013. The [project document](#) (equivalent to the grant agreement) has been signed on May 30<sup>th</sup> 2014. Implementation of the project has started thereafter. The R-PP endorsed by FCPF's PC in 2013 has been up-dated for submission to the UN-REDD Secretariat and consideration of the PB. At UN-REDD's PB13, Honduras secured the allocation of USD 3,609,645 to support the implementation of its readiness process.

Following PB13, SERNA (now branded as MiAmbiente) with the support from FAO, UNDP and UNEP has lead the development of a draft NP results framework based on the activities agreed earlier prior to the submission of Honduras' NP executive summary to the UN-REDD Secretariat. The results framework was envisioned to be agreed by key counterparts, like members of the REDD+ Sub-committee, and "Confederación de Pueblos Autóctonos de Honduras" (CONPAH) delegates, as well as by relevant MiAmbiente technical units and the UN-REDD agencies. This mission was intended to consolidate the results framework as well as to discuss it with key counterparts. Additionally, it was intended to define a roadmap towards Honduras' NP document signature.

*9.b Findings*

1. A FAO mission took place in Honduras to assess the progresses on MRV prior to this mission. The purpose was to adjust FREL and NFMS activities to the current situation in the country. As a result, some changes on activites related to UN-REDD support to FREL and NFMS were discussed and agreed. These changes do not affect the total budget agreed previously.

2. During this mission and based on the additional information provided by FAO two main changes were agreed on the work on FREL and NFMS. The first change consist on re-allocating the budget originally assigned to support the development of a “biomass map” to support the “activity data” component as part of the process to estimate emissions factors. The second change consist of re-allocating resources originally assigned to develop a methodological protocol to estimate emissions from forest degradation. Those resources now are allocated to support estimating emissions factors too.
3. The rest of activities proposed for the REDD+ NS did not change. The rationale to build-on the activities previously identified under the FCPF project was re-visited to help clarifying the linkages and sequence.
4. With the support of UN-REDD: technical inputs will be developed for the REDD+ NS, and stakeholder engagement will be broadened beyond IPs. Activities related to consultation with IPs have been also included in in order to comply with previous commitments that the Government has signed with IPs leaders. Those commitments have made it possible to move forward on the REDD+ readiness process in the country.
5. MRV’s work will build on the progress achieved by other cooperation agencies like GiZ and USAID, as well as on the activities to be implemented by FCPF funding. On FREL those activities will focus on supporting the submission of a deforestation FREL, including facilitating the dialogue with UNFCCC reviewers, and capacity building. Activities on the NFMS will focus on support the definition of emission factors, consolidation of a system to determine “activity data”, support the development of a module to estimate emissions and removals, and capacity building to the “forest monitoring group” and indigenous representatives.
6. SIS work will build on the activities planned by GiZ and FCPF. FCPF will take over the previous work funded by GiZ to propose a design of a SIS (including legal, institutional and operational arrangements). UN-REDD will take over that work to support setting up the SIS.
7. A meeting with REDD+ readiness cooperation programs active in Honduras took place during this mission. MiAmbiente requested that all cooperation programs be aligned with the “programmatic approach” promoted by the Government. It also requested to create a platform for regular coordination of support in the country, under the leadership of MiAmbiente’s external cooperation office. MiAmbiente presented a REDD+ readiness general roadmap, which will be the basis to organize the support.
8. Other Government agencies and CSOs representatives, including IPs leaders participated in the meeting. Each of them presented their views on the agenda presented by MiAmbiente, and ratified their willingness to engage. Notably, DINAFROH (National Directorate for IPs and Afro-Honduran Affairs) reiterated their will to serve as the Government focal point to promote the REDD+ indigenous agenda, including activities related to FPIC. Both MiAmbiente and CSOs representatives indicated that the agenda under discussion should not get stuck in REDD+ technicalities and rather should promote actions that go beyond REDD+. The participation of other relevant Government agencies need to be strengthened.
9. Finally, a workshop took place to discuss UN-REDD’s NP results framework, with the group that MiAmbiente has led to discuss the design of FCPF and UN-REDD (Government, CSOs and IPs representatives). Only few general comments were presented, therefore the Government and UN-REDD teams got the basis to continue working on the UN-REDD NP project document.

#### *9.c Results achieved (key outputs)*

1. **UN-REDD Honduras’ NP Results Framework defined:** Based on the previous proposal (list of activities, budget, and NP’s executive summary) presented by MiAmbiente and agreed with key counterparts, the results framework was defined, following some adjustments in specific activities . The total budget remains at USD 3,373,500 to support 6 outcomes and 11 products. For organizational purposes the proposal follows the same structure of two components, as per the UNDP-FCPC Project. A summary of the language in the results framework is presented as follows. As part of component 1 (REDD+ NS Development) 2 outcomes have been defined: (1) strengthened participatory spaces for the REDD+ NS development; and (2) inputs for the definition of PaMs developed. Under component 2 (REDD+ NS implementation framework) 4 outcomes have been defined: (1) REDD+ financial mechanism defined; (2) technical capacities strengthened to define a deforestation FREL; (3) support provided for NFMS functioning; and (4) SIS operational.

In order to have better opportunities to ensure coordination on the ground between the UNDP-FCPF and the UN-REDD NP activities, a single PMU will undertake the two programs, under MiAmbiente Projects Coordination Unit.

2. **Roadmap towards Honduras' UN-REDD NP signature:** A roadmap towards finalizing and signing the project document was defined (see details in section 11). The aim is to submit the signed project document to the UN-REDD Secretariat by mid May.

#### *9.d Expected outcomes and impacts*

As a result of this mission and related follow up, it is expected that Honduras will successfully finish the development of the UN-REDD NP project document and start implementation thereafter.
