## 9. Brief summary of the mission

The principal objective of the mission to Asossa, regional capital of Benishangul-Gumuz, was to provide guidance to the local team responsible for the rollout of the regional REDD+ readiness strategy. The UN-REDD TS supports the region in the development of a regional REDD+ readiness strategy and the analysis of institutional arrangemets, decision-making processes and issues between national and regional level land-use planning, agriculture expansion and other REDD+ related aspects. My role was to provide technical input to the ICA implementation in the region which is in a critical phase and lead by Dr. Alemayhu Ayana (national ICA consultant). The inception workshop for the TS in the pilot region provided a platform for awareness raising for REDD+ and to present the UN-REDD targeted support components, the regional workplan and key activities.

A focus group discussion with 7 vice-administrators of the region has been held to collect information about decision making processes, key actors, and policy issues in the regional efforts on combating deforestation and forest degradation. The discussion mainly focused on issues and contradictions between national and regional decision making and policy processes at the subregional level (protection of forest land/NR vs. agricultural expansion).

A women's focus group was conducted by the NC and regional project coordinator, concrete input to the questionaire and parameters was provided in advance.

### 9.a Findings

It was observed that the ambiguity of Ethiopian governance structures will be challenging for the implementation of the REDD+ process in the region, specifically with regards to institutional mandates, de facto devolution of decision making and competencies and contradictions in main policies implemented by the same institution (i.e. bureau of land administration and environmental protection).<sup>1</sup>

The ICA approach will be an adequate tool to uncover those ambiguities and put them into institutional context and key actors in the region. However, the local team expressed concerns that sensitive information might be problematic when it comes to the dissemination of the ICA report. The UN-REDD mission team clarified that the ICA is a mean to inform UNDP and UN-REDD regional and national teams about possible pitfalls and potential risks, and that it is important to inform decision makers early enough about key Government and political authorities to be involved in the process.

It was therefore agreed that the ICA report in the region should follow an issue-based approach, identifying cases, which

can demonstrate where the problems are and how to avoid those in future planning/REDD+ implementation. The parameters for the regional ICA were proposed as follows:

- Regional horizontal coordination issues: who collaborates with whom on which issues?
- Vertical coordination and decision making processes (key actors and de-facto processes) whom to involve for the real decisions?
- Major policy and regulatory contradictions at the regional level
- Mapping on key stakeholders and advice on engagement (advocacy, awareness raising, active engagement empowerment)

# 9.b Results achieved (key outputs)

- 1. Participants of the regional inception workshop have understood and endorsed the ICA methodology and scope for the region.
- 2. Intensive discussions with the consultant and regional implementation team have refined the ICA focus in order to provide relevant information for regional implementation
- 3. The first draft ICA report for national consultations has been discussed intensively and comments provided to the NC

# 9.c Expected outcomes and impacts

The ICA will assist the regional team to understand the politics, possible pitfalls and risks of implementing REDD+ readiness in the region.
