National UN-REDD Programmes

- Initially 9 pilot countries
- 6 have received funding approval
 - Panama the latest to be approved
- 3 have signed national programmes
- UN-REDD global programme & UN Agencies supporting early action
- 5 new countries join UN-REDD network



UN Value for Initial Readiness

- Country-led delivery & capacity building
- Facilitating stakeholder engagement process
- Trusted partner
- On-the-ground presence, backed with regional technical expertise
- Resonance with UN Agencies' work on forests, environment, governance and development
- Assurance measures in place to ensure quality control




Assurance Measures

- UN-REDD Programme Operational Guidance
- UN rights-based approach to development
- UN Development Group approach to programming
 - i.e. UNDG Guidance Note on Environmental Sustainability
- UN country teams and regional technical experts
- UN Harmonized Financial Transfers
 - Determines the most appropriate means of transferring funds to National Implementing Partners
 - Assesses fiduciary arrangements and absorptive capacity
- Strong "learning-by-doing" approach
- Harmonized Readiness Components with FCPF

UN-REDD Policy Board, 29-30 October

- Progress shared at the UN-REDD Policy Board last week
- Observations:
 - UN-REDD underpinned by substantive progress by countries
 - Emerging approaches to national readiness management
 - Significant contributions from new countries
 i.e. Ecuador
 - UN-REDD well-suited to phased approach



Readiness Management Arrangements

Start-up Activities

- The formulation of REDD "roadmaps" has greatly helped to clarify required interventions, and those for which UN-REDD has a comparative advantage.
- This has been done in PNG and Viet Nam, and is being undertaken in Zambia
- Strong emphasis on stakeholder engagement mechanisms

Stakeholder Consultation and Participation

- Validation meetings are very useful to ensure stakeholder involvement is initiated before PB approval.
 Clearly demonstrated in Panama
- The establishment of a broad-based multi-stakeholder consultation mechanism can dramatically increase confidence in the process among all stakeholders.






DRC Approach

- Scoping mission in January 2009 organized jointly with FCPF with broad stakeholder engagement, resulting in:
- A Decree to support REDD:
 - National Coordination mechanism
 - Interministerial Committee
 - National REDD Committee
- DRC civil society has commended the UN-REDDled process
