# **Concept Note**

# 1. Background

Papua New Guinea (PNG) has one of the most significant areas of largely-intact tropical forest in the world, although these forests appear to be facing acute and imminent threats. Forests are also a vital resource for the local population particularly in the remote rural areas of PNG, providing food, fibre, building materials, and support a variety of wildlife and ecosystem services. The Papua New Guinea Forest Authority (PNGFA) estimates that approximately 80% of the total area of the country is covered by natural forests, 60% of which are intact forests.

A mechanism for Reduced Emissions from Deforestation and Degradation (REDD+) being developed through the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) provides an opportunity to support PNG's efforts to reduce levels of deforestation and help to maintain and protect its natural forest.

PNG has been a leading proponent of REDD+ at the international level, and has made significant progress towards developing the capacity to engage in an international mechanism on REDD+. This progress has initially been supported by the UN-REDD Programme and is now being aided by the Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF) REDD+ Readiness Project that will run until the end of 2018.

# 2. Current Activities

The FCPF REDD+ Readiness Project was started in March 2015 and fits the overall objectives of REDD+ Readiness funding in PNG which is "to contribute to the development of PNG's capacity to design a sound national REDD+ strategy, develop and sustain national readiness management arrangements, elaborate REDD+ strategy options, develop the REDD+ implementation framework, assess social and environmental impacts so that, by 2018, PNG is ready to implement policies and measures to reduce emissions from its forests and to enhance removals under the UNFCCC REDD+ mechanism". This objective is being supported also by the UN-REDD and other bilateral partners. Since the UN-REDD Programme is mainly focused on NFMS and FREL/FRL, the FCPF REDD+ Readiness Project will focus on **establishing capacities for efficient management of REDD+ and the National REDD+ Strategy**. Consequently, the following two Outcomes will be pursued:

**Outcome 1:** Capacities exist for effective and efficient management of REDD+, including full and effective participation of all relevant stakeholders

#### Outcome 2: The National REDD+ strategy

The project is jointly implemented by Climate Change and Development Authority (CCDA) as the Government of PNG's (GoPNG) lead implementing agency with technical support from the PNG Forest Authority (PNGFA) as the responsible party. The UNDP PNG Country Office, as FCPF delivery partner,

provides overall support to the project in order to ensure effective delivery of project outcomes and outputs, including disbursement of funds in line with the signed project document.

The project is financially supported by the World Bank's FCPF with total budget amount of USD 3.8 million for three years. The official start date of the project is March 2015 and end date is December 2018.

## 3. Goal and objectives

As mentioned above, one of the key outcomes of the FCPF project is to support the development of PNG's National REDD+ Strategy. For this process to be successful it is critical that key stakeholders have a strong understanding of what REDD+ is and the different elements that go into developing and implementing a national policy approach to REDD+.

As part of this the government is working to identify key stakeholders to receive training on REDD+ to deepen their capacity to engage in the process as well as inform others of what REDD+ is and why it is relevant in PNG.

This process has been initiated within the context of the FCPF REDD+ Readiness Project by running a series of multi-day **Expert Training Events** outside of Port Moresby to help key stakeholders not only increase their understanding of REDD+ but also strengthen linkages between their different organisations.

Specific objectives of the event are as follows:

- Increase the understanding of key stakeholders on how REDD+ Policies and Measures (PAMs) can / will be implemented and initiate discussions around potential PAMs and possible approaches;
- Strengthen links between key national stakeholders to facilitate future work on REDD+;
- Discuss the recently published paper on 'Issues and Options' for PNG's National REDD+ Strategy;
- Increase stakeholders' knowledge on REDD+ finance and the role of voluntary carbon market (VCM) projects and allow for the development of an 'in principle' approach that can then be taken back to senior decision makers
