Lessons in Engagement with UN-REDD Programme

Government Reflection from SRI LANKA









Status of the Programme to date:

Sri Lanka UN-REDD Programme commenced its implementation in September 2013









Highlights:

- Programme Executive Board (PEB),
- Indigenous Peoples Forum (IPF),
- Civil Society Organization (CSO) Platform and
- MRV & NP&S Task Forces
- Private sector Forum









Rationale:

REDD+ in Sri Lanka recognizes the importance of stakeholders commitment & participation; hence their involvement will help the country to design and come up with a clear strategy









Process: Continuous Dialogue

Informal and Formal Meetings, Workshops etc:

 Constant Engagement of respective stakeholders separately and collectively in raising awareness, briefing on the emerging trends and informing the findings of the studies and seeking their opinions









 Facilitating separate meetings to take their own decisions on the readiness phase activities based on the approved work plan;

 Representation at the PEB which is the highest body of the programme which takes decisions.









How has engaging with CSO and IP representatives, and other key stakeholders' assisted REDD+ in the country?

Sharing their views and expressing their opinions at various workshops/meetings









What areas have the CSO and IP representatives contributed to, specifically in relation to the national programme, and national REDD+ process, as well as broader national goals, e.g., drivers study, national REDD+ strategy etc;?

Institutional review, D&D study, Private sector study and CBR+CP development.









How gender consideration and women's inclusion are integrated in the process ?

It is rather slow but the process is getting rejuvenated; UN-REDD targeted support has been received for a Gender study









How differences in expectations are addressed?

By discussions, negotiations and through consensus building and aligning with the REDD+ objectives and within the national development agenda of the country









Communication and Awareness

 The workshops at national level held in English and free expression was curtailed to some extent; - At all possible occasions communication in Sinhala was encouraged as most were comfortable with it.











 IP representations at national events were limited to the PEB meeting held quarterly;

Currently there is no direct solution for it since the distance of travelling from six different locations is very difficult and they are reluctant to spend nights in Colombo & Hotels











The level of operations of members of the CSO platform varies from national, provincial to Local;

Number of awareness programmes were conducted to build the capacity to contribute to national programmes











Divergent views of stakeholders exist;

with separate and collective groupings these has been addressed and gradually these will be sorted out, the countries road map & strategy for REDD+ will be collectively agreed and deliberations are planned.











Gender concerns:

Plans are underway to improve the current status









Emerging Opportunities from Stakeholder Engagement in Sri Lanka

 Many of the CSO Platform membership gradually taking up to performing the national tasks on **REDD+ and other environment issues**

 A strong participation of the CSO Platform membership with very constructive inputs to enrich some of the completed studies





Emerging Opportunities from Stakeholder Engagement in Sri Lanka

 At District level the CSOs and the Forest officers are jointly planning the awareness workshops for CSO/CBOs

Informal discussions with gender groups

 The already short-listed 15 CBR+ grant proposals include more than 80 percent of the CSO Platform members;
Indicate that they are in line with REDD+
