







(DAY 1) Working Group Discussion: Main Challenges and Opportunities at National Level









1. What are the current or emerging changes/impacts you have seen through your participation in the REDD+ processes in your country and why?

Myanmar:

- there was no discussion of IPs rights in the past;
- Now the Forestry Department invite IPs to discuss about:
 - > FPIC;
 - REDD+ helped to raise issue;
 - Training to FD staff and discuss barriers;
 - Communities: illegal logging and did not how to address; and
 - Publications now possible e.g. WB

Viet Nam:

- Never have CSO/IPs before;
- FPIC new though REDD+;
- "Grassroots democracy" not clear before but now IPs can talk about traditional knowledge – only in Law on BD and NRAP;
- IPs representatives at provincial level.

Bangladesh

- Department of Forestry
- Hostile relationship with IPs "Rulers and Ruled"
- Better communication because of REDD+
- Leaders have demanded platform has not happened
 May 6, 2015 first meeting and FD promised to continue

Cambodia

- Improved understanding and networking
- Now CSOs, IPs, and the government could work together

Sri Lanka:

- IPs rights: After 1982 development programme restated rights
- 1996 IP conference in Geneva
- REDD+ -- 2nd opportunity
- Now aware of the rights and can take issues to national level









1. What are the current or emerging changes/impacts you have seen through your participation in the REDD+ processes in your country and why?

AIIP:

- Partnership with local government in VN and five provinces: training on FPIC
- CSOs and IPs co-chaired TWG
- Bangladesh: No publications previously









2. What are the key challenges the CSO or IP still face in the REDD+ process, and what areas could be improved?

Cambodia

- Improved understanding and networking
- Communication flow not yet effective
- IPs still face danger in forest
- IPs from other countries speak English
- Mainstreaming gender is still a challenge
- Communities reluctant to participate in training
- Local authority block awareness raising
- Incomplete in ...

Sri Lanka

Language issue – need to translate into Veddha (IPs local language)

Myanmar

- Level of understanding is different -- Interferes with discussion
- Land tenure especially for those who practice migratory lifestyle
- Other government agencies need to be more open e.g. Agriculture/mining

Viet Nam

- Local government of REDD+
- Human rights not well understood,
 - E.g. ILO 169/UNDRIP
- IP women's engagement limited
- Tenure still not adequately dealt with
 - E.g. in the North Forest allocation but not in Centre Highlands
- Improve awareness need key person in each community

Bangladesh

- Hill tract: 13 communities
- Plains: 30 communities
- Laws to protect forest and BD and consultation
- Land grabbing suspicion under REDD+
- Lack of information
- Need to be involved in committees
- Forest concept/definition missing
- Resource for awareness raising
- Lack of respect for culture and traditional knowledge









2. What are the key challenges the CSO or IP still face in the REDD+ process, and what areas could be improved?

AIPP

- The change of roles in the government/changes in government officials
- Number of IPs represented in working group
- Lack of confidence to speak in front of government official
- Lack of engagement in studies e.g. ...









3. How you ensure that you represent the views of your constituencies and keep them informed?

Myanmar

- Needs to be trusted
- IPs representative need to inform constituents clearly in homeland
- Find ways to explain REDD+ simply

Sri Lanka

- IPs assembly decision given to government (since 1996, once a year), government funding + revenue raising
- Radio transmissions

Viet Nam

- Network: 13 provinces VTIK (29 branches and annual conference)
- Em UN-REDD network will line with VTIK
- Work with District/Commune government

Cambodia

- Arrangements for information flow
- Ensure feeding into decision making
- Convene stakeholders
- Increase public awareness for IPs
- Share information with communities

Bangladesh

- Existing network: 7 regions 25 organizations
 - Provide feedback
 - Local and regional meetings

AIPP

- Cambodia: Informal Working Group
- Frequent communicate with members
 - Monthly Skype call
