



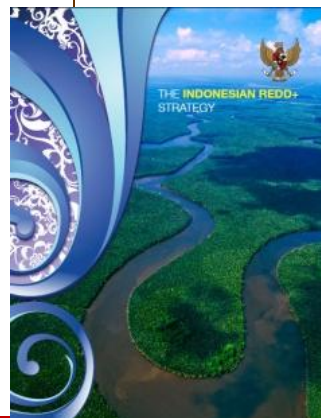
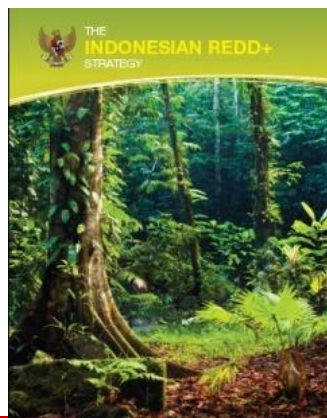
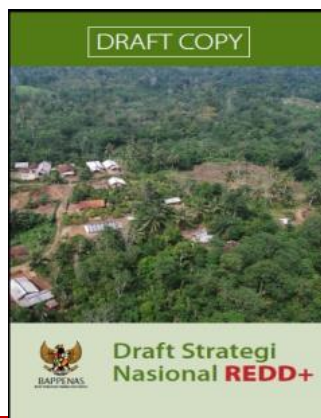
PRINCIPLES OF FORMULATION OF REDD+ NASTRA

4 MAIN PRINCIPLES

1. **Inclusivity**, to ensure the effectiveness of the stakeholder's involvement
2. **Transparent**, to provide the open comments/feedbacks from stakeholders
3. **Credibility**, to have two way dialogue
4. **Institutionalization**, to formulize rigid and tested public consultation.

4 COMMUNICATION METHODS

- a. **Mass media**, to distribute the accurate and relevant information
- b. **Press realease**, about the opinion and status of the progress of the formulation of the strategy
- c. **Announcement and statement**, conducted to be international forum
- d. **Workshops, roadshow and seminars**, conducted in various levels, from grass root to experts to clarify .

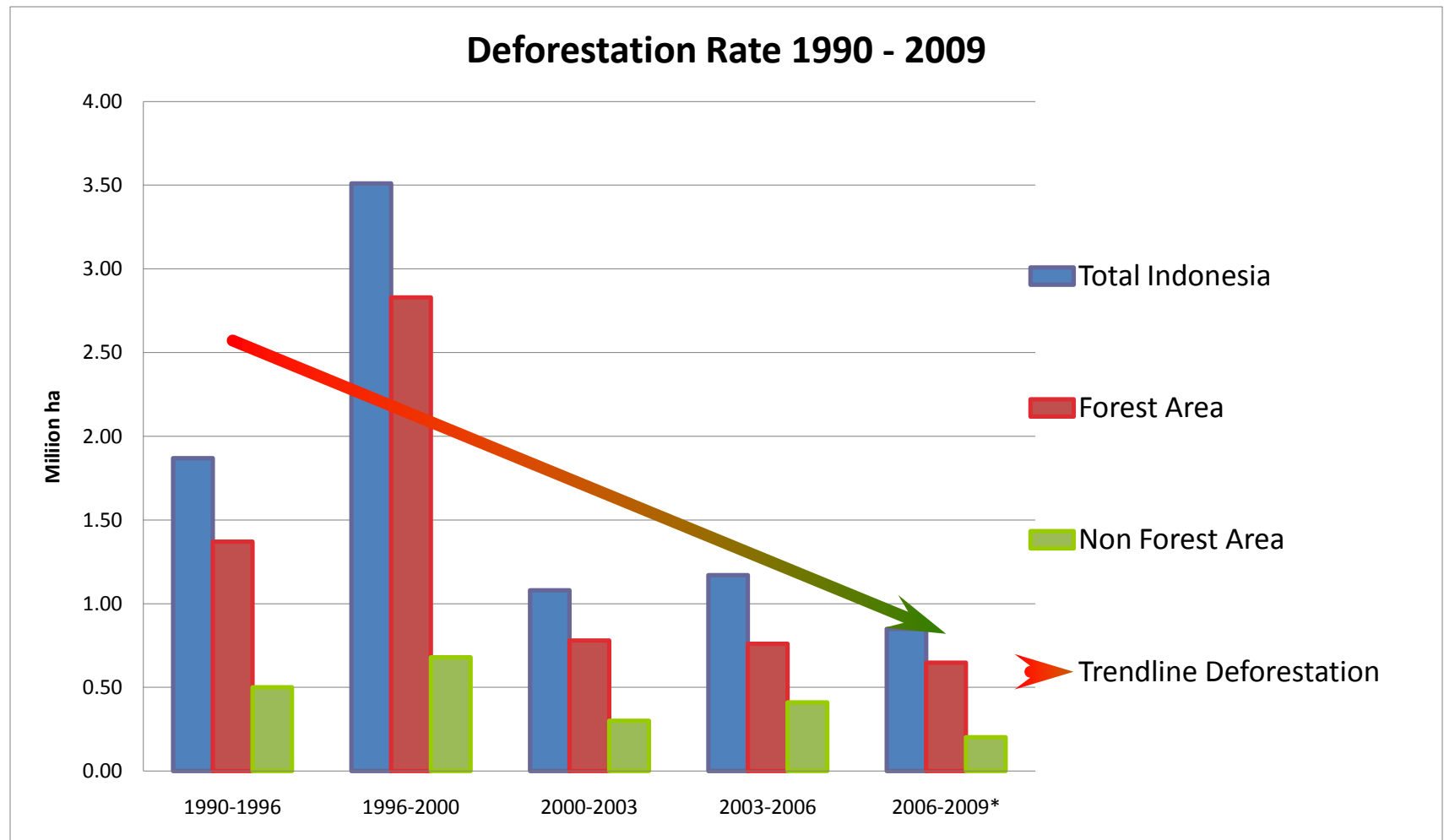

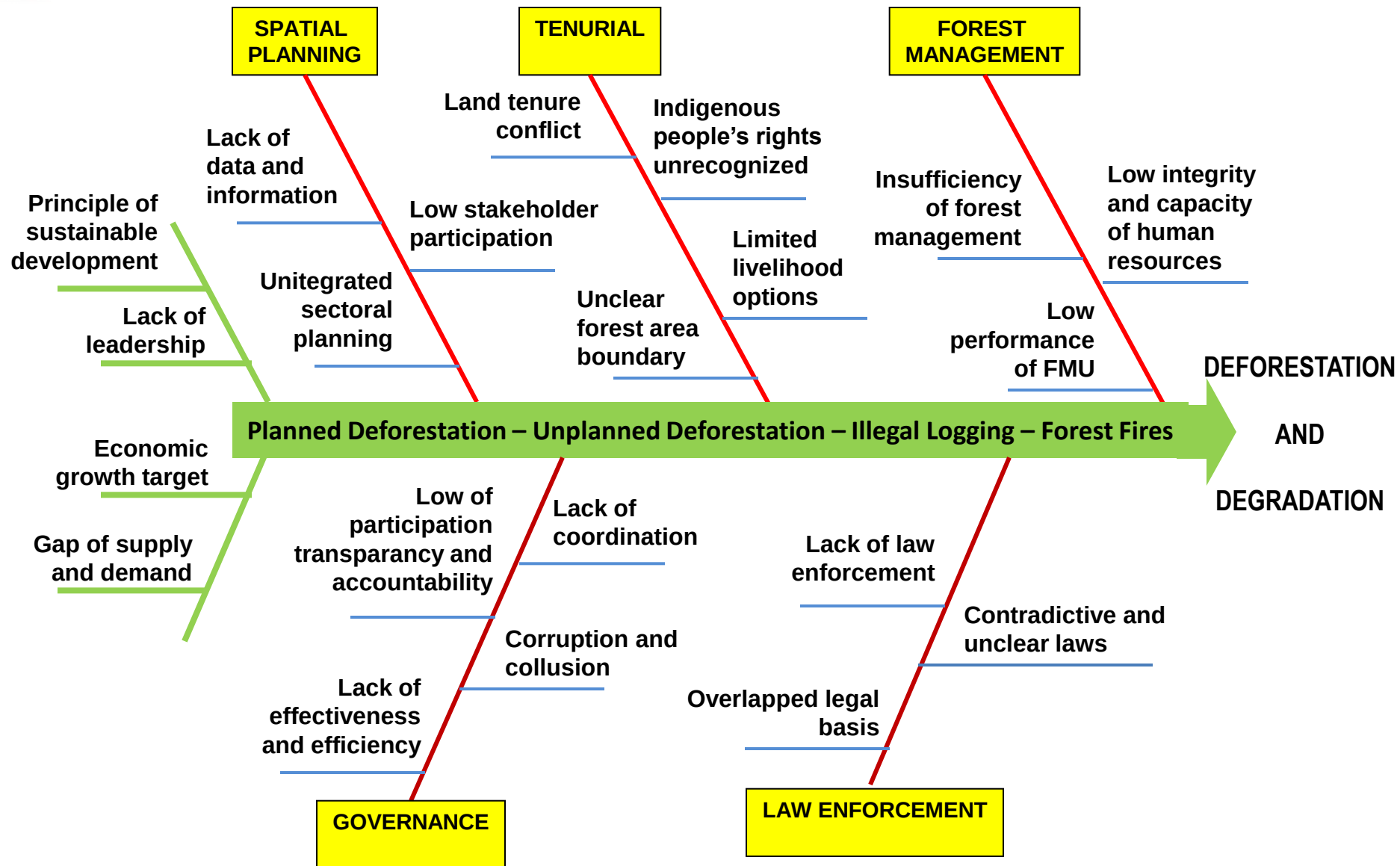

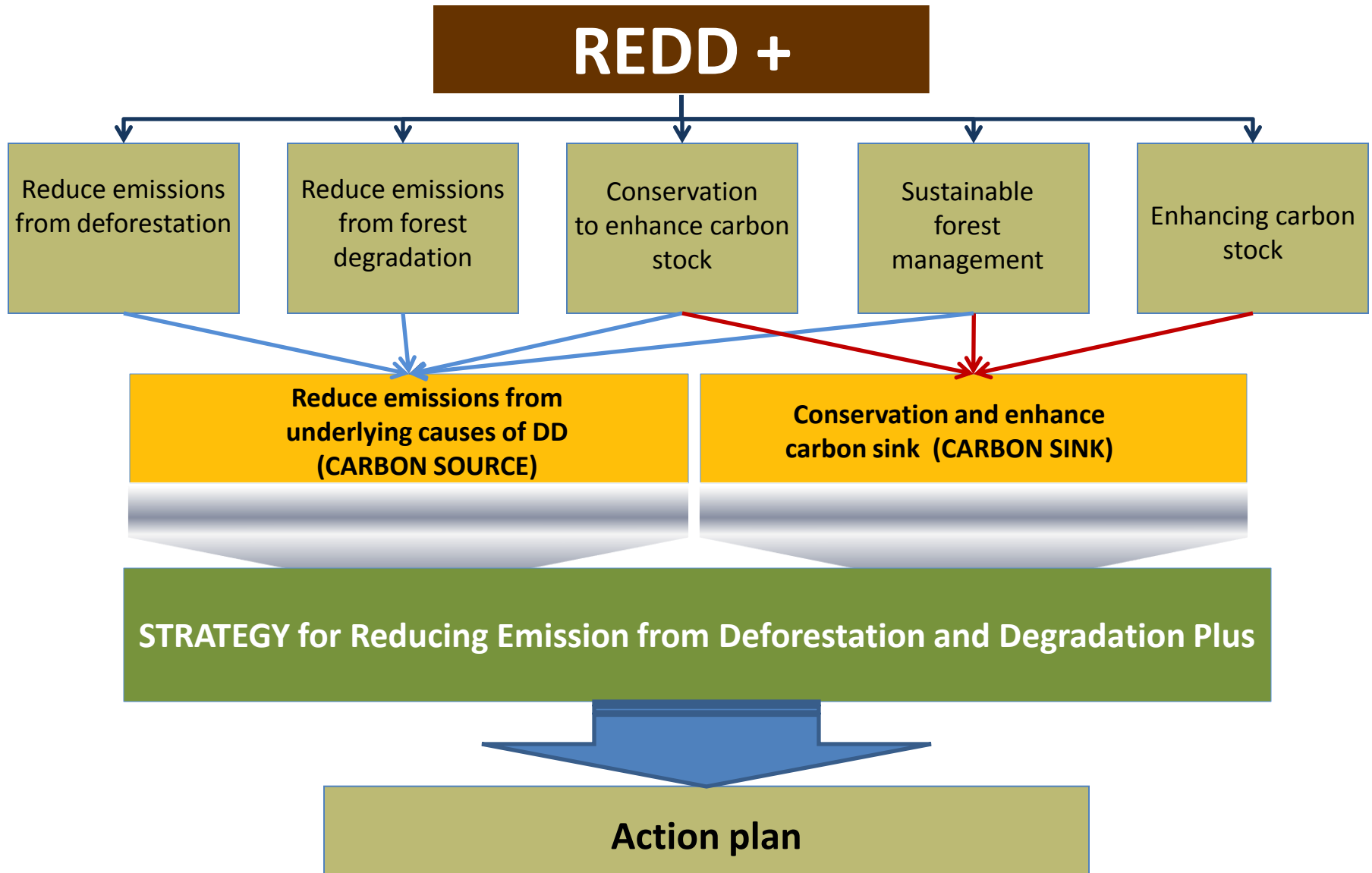

Strategy 2: Reformation on Sector Development

Program

Reform on Forestry Sector Development

- Main program for reducing carbon source
 - Strengthening the role of conservation into policy development and program on forestry development sector
 - Strengthening sustainable forest management (SFM)
 - Increasing law enforcement at forestry unit management at ground level
 - Developing peat land management at forestry area
- Main program for enhancing and protecting carbon sink

Reform on Agriculture Sector Development

- Developing low carbon agriculture planning
- Implementing intensification of agriculture
- Optimizing unused land
- Implementing land swap policy at thick peat land area
- Implementing intermittent irrigation system
- Extending agriculture area at degraded land and mineral land
- Provision of incentive to concession holders for implementing land swap
- Improvement peat land management

Reform on Mining Sector Development

- Improving legal framework at mining sector related to REDD+
- Improving mining plan
- Increasing supervision for mining and provision of license
- Increasing mining reclamation

Reform on other Land Use Sector

- Improving infrastructure development planning with considering carbon emission aspects.
- Improving related sector with considering carbon emission aspects
