UN-REDD Programme

- Joint Programme
- Established in 2008 by the FAO, UNDP and UNEP
- Helps countries to get ready to benefit from the REDD+ mechanism





UN-REDD Programme

- Works at a global & national level by providing
 - Technical advice
 - Methods and tools
 - Stakeholder involvement
- To support the development and implementation of national REDD+ strategies
 - → Country ownership and leadership





Funding & Governance


- Current funding: US\$105 million
- Donor countries:
 - Norway
 - Spain
 - Denmark







- Governed by Policy Board
 - Meets 2 times per year
- Secretariat in Geneva coordination UN-REDD

- Tools on measurement and assessment (forest inventories, remote sensing)

 - Developing legal frameworks and law enforcement

Co-benefits include:


- Biodiversity

- UN-REDD is supporting countries to:
 - Maximize socio-economic and ecological cobenefits
 - Improve equitable benefit sharing





Biodiversity and other ecosystem services

- Spatial analyses of the relationship between carbon storage, biodiversity and ecosystem services
- Support for addressing ecosystem co-benefits in Vietnam, Indonesia, Tanzania, Bolivia... etc





Multiple Benefits - next steps...
