- use of the UNDG guidelines for results-based management and the 2015 MPTF guide to « designing pooled funds for performance »
- coming together of work streams dealing with the results framework, RADAR (REDD analysis of data, assessment & reporting) & UN-REDD Programme reporting
- informal working group sessions and consultation with the management group in September & October 2015
- draft proposal for results framework circulated as background paper, November 2015

Critical issues



Overall aim is to use the results framework & tracking tools to develop a comprehensive results-based management system for the 2016-20 Programme. This has entailed:

- Ensuring that progress tracking, reporting & the agreed indicators are « consistent »
- Agreeing on a set of SMART specific, measurable, achievable, relevant & time-bound – indicators
- Including means of verification, assumptions & risks
- Incorporating cross-cutting themes in tracking system at outcome level

Reduce forest emissions and enhance carbon stocks in forests while advancing national sustainable development

- Emission reductions (tCO2eq./year) from deforestation & forest degradation as well as carbon stock enhancement;
- Progress towards the SDG targets, particularly with respect to forest ecosystems (NB: SDG indicators are being prepared for March 2016)





Countries implement actions that deliver both carbon and non-carbon benefits from forests in accordance with UNFCCC decisions

- Number of partner countries ready to implement & monitor results-based actions (i.e. are "REDD ready") leading to emissions reductions as defined by the UNFCCC;
- Demonstration of quantifiable social and environmental benefits generated through REDD+ policies & measures;
- Number of partner countries implementing policy and institutional reforms that improve forest governance.



Proposed indicators for outcome 1



National contributions to the mitigation of climate change through REDD+ are **designed and adopted**, including the provision of additional social and environmental benefits and in conformity with UNFCCC safeguards

- completeness of the REDD+ national strategies and/or action plans;
- compliance of national strategies and/or action plans with social inclusion and gender equity principles;
- anchoring of national strategies and/or action plans in development policy making institutions;
- completeness of designed safeguards approach to address social and environmental benefits;
- satisfaction with UN-REDD Programme support for NS/AP and safeguard design.





National contributions to the mitigation of climate change through REDD+ are **measured reported and verified** with the necessary institutional arrangements in place

- robustness of the FREL/FRL submissions to the UNFCCC;
- robustness of the BUR REDD+ annex (update) submissions to the UNFCCC;
- completeness of national forest monitoring systems;
- operational effectiveness of the national forest monitoring systems;
- satisfaction with UN-REDD Programme support for establishing the FREL/FRL and the NFMS.



Proposed indicators for outcome 3



Drivers of deforestation and forest degradation are addressed through the **implementation of policies and measures** (results-based actions) with social and environmental safeguards addressed and respected

- extent to which policies and measures have tangibly addressed the identified drivers;
- *mobilization of finance to implement REDD+ policies and measures;*
- performance based finance secured, e.g. through the Green Climate Fund (GCF);
- extent to which safeguards are addressed and respected during implementation of REDD+ policies and measures;
- satisfaction with UN-REDD Programme support for the implementation of REDD+ policies and measures.



What next?



- Approval of final results framework by new executive board in early 2016
- Define baselines & targets according to proposed scope of 2016-20 Programme (country selection – next session...)
- Develop an operational « M&E » guide for data collection & reporting (initial draft is ready...)
- Link to country programme design with specification of outputs to be achieved with Programme resources
- Further interaction with UNFCCC for means of verification (linking REDD+ actions with INDCs for LULUCF)
