## II. BACKGROUND<sup>2</sup>

At the Forest Monitoring Systems and Forest Reference Levels for REDD+ Regional Workshop in Hanoi, Viet Nam, 20-22 October 2014, the idea of sub-regional support to the Pacific on Forest Reference (Emission) Levels (FRELs/FRLs) was conceived with country representatives from Fiji, Solomon Islands and Papua New Guinea. Pacific UN-REDD countries identified a need for enhanced capacity building on the topic of FREL/FRL. The concept is to bring together Pacific UN-REDD countries for intensive capacity building and learning by doing exercises on FREL/FRL. This will be followed by ongoing technical support and a cycle of expert feedback for the development of actual FREL/FRL for four pacific countries. Vanuatu has applied for membership to the UN-REDD programme, and it is expected, they will become formal UN-REDD members prior to the commencement of activities under this TS.

As the newest member of UN-REDD, Fiji would like enhanced support on the topic of FREL/FRL. This support can be delivered to Fiji and several Pacific countries simultaneously. This is consistent with the successful approach of the project "Strengthening Regional Support to National Forest Monitoring Systems for REDD+ in the Pacific" whereby under the leadership of the Secretariat for the Pacific Community's (SPC) located in Fiji, and with funding through UN-REDD, the technical and capacity-related barriers faced by Pacific Island Countries for the development and implementation of national forest monitoring systems for REDD+ is being overcome.

Under the project "Strengthening Regional Support to National Forest Monitoring Systems for REDD+ in the Pacific" countries are compiling Activity Data using the Collect Earth tool. This Activity Data, which can be compiled into a historical time series of land use and land use change, can be used as the basis for constructing FREL/FRL. Preliminary Emission Factors are also being compiled for Pacific countries. Therefore, during the workshop, draft FREL/FRL can be constructed based on this data in "learning by doing" exercises. With subsequent technical support from FAO, the draft FREL/FRL constructed in this workshop will subject a cycle of expert review and elaboration toward possible FREL/FRL submissions to the UNFCCC. This TS will also support an expert working sessions on the draft FREL/FRL in three Pacific Island Countries. PNG has a UN-REDD NP with funds available to support a FREL/FRL expert working session, and hence it is not included in this TS request.

Construction of preliminary FREL/FRL will be based on a guided dialogue with country experts on the following aspects:

- Forest definition
- Scope (Activities)
- Scale (National / Sub-national)
- Data and Methodologies

This TS request also capitalises on the regional convening power of SPC, who regularly convene expert technical workshops to Pacific Island Countries.

Therefore, the main objective of this targeted support is to deliver targeted capacity building and the drafting of actual FREL/FRL for Fiji, PNG, Solomon Islands, and Vanuatu.
