## REQUEST FOR TARGETED SUPPORT<sup>1</sup>

## II. BACKGROUND<sup>2</sup>

As a member of UN-REDD programme, Nepalwould like to request technical support on the topic of Forest Reference[Emission] Levels (FRL) in 2015. Nepal is in the process of preparing a FRL for submission to the UNFCCC, but has been hindered by the low in-country capacity on this topic. This has resulted in low levels of Nepalese engagement in the drafting of FRLs.

This targeted support request will provide capacity building on FRL to Nepalese REDD+ stakeholders, and will support the drafting and refinement of Nepal's FRL with in-country working sessions and an expert review cycle.

A capacity building workshop scheduled for April 2015 will build capacity among Nepal's REDD+ stakeholders on the important decisions to be taken in the context of FRL including;

- Forest definition
- Scope (Activities)
- Scale (National / Sub-national)
- Data and Methodologies

Several other Asian countries (Bhutan, Pakistan, Mongolia, Bangladesh, and Sri Lanka) are at a similar stage of FRL development, and technical specialists can therefore benefit from participation in the Nepal FRL capacity building workshop. Hence, this targeted support will support the travel and participation of technical specialists from Bhutan, Pakistan, Mongolia, Bangladesh, and Sri Lanka and build capacity on the topic of FRL in six Asian countries simultaneously.

Enhanced support is required to guide Nepal in the process of preparing a comprehensive FRL for submission to the UNFCCC. Nepal intends to submit a FRL to the UNFCCC during 2015, therefore high-level support and guidance is urgently needed.

This improved in-country capacity will initiate a more informed dialogue on the technical decisions Nepal needs to make in the context of FRL which will be elaborated in working sessions with in-country technical experts and will lead to the drafting of FRLs. Draft FRLs will then be subject to a technical review process supported by experts, and culminating in the submission of a FRL to the UNFCCC during 2015.


