UN-REDD Indonesia

- UN-REDD aims to build capacity of Indonesia to achieve REDD readiness
- REDD readiness includes awareness and capacity developed to appropriately conduct consultations with all stakeholders of REDD+ implementation, including local government and also local/traditional/customary communities (Adat community)– Forest based community.





Pros & Cons REDD in Indonesia

By privates \rightarrow Plantation association.

By NGOs \rightarrow some NGOs reject REDD mechanism because it will marginalize community, it will only enrich wealthy people, CO2 based new colonial. Communications strateg)

- Awareness of and understanding of REDD+ in Indonesia among stakeholders including local government, privates, customary/Adat and local communities is currently still very limited.
- UN-REDD's Communications Strategy will play an important role in raising awareness and preparing local communities for engagement with REDD+.
- Materials will be targeted to the needs of all stakeholders including customary/Adat and local communities → UNEP's output 1.3.: design communication & social marketing of REDD+

Targeted to local government & community

REDD+: High impact decisions

- Develop a comprehensive baseline dataset and identify areas of REDD+-eligible forest
- Analyze opportunity costs of alternative land uses
- Analyze the potential socio-economic impacts of REDD+ on communities
- Mainstream REDD+ into existing spatial, forest utilization and FMU planning at District level
- District based consensus on land and forest use allocation,
- Approve the REDD+ mainstreamed spatial plan
- Capacity needs assessment
- Design of capacity building & training
- Training of trainers
- Conduct of training and other capacity building activities
- Assessment of follow-up activities required to improve and sustain capacity
- Assess five districts in which REDD+ is most feasible
- Socialize REDD+ to these districts
- Invite these districts to present their proposals and ensure political readiness to implement REDD+
- Agree with the selected district on an implementation framework.

Provincial level: capacity building on methodologies & REDD+ toolkit

District level: spatial planning capacity building activities

Community level: empowering community to get REDD+ benefit

The UN-REDD Programme in Indonesia covers a very broad range of activities. The level at which consultations will take place will thus need to vary for each activity, according to the context

National level consultation framework

- Conducted consultations with multistakeholders including CSOs in developing UNREDD activities and developing workplan.

 all stakeholders aware of UNREDD activities
- Collaborate with National Forestry Body (Dewan Kehutanan Nasional-DKN): Community Chamber.
 - Purpose: to facilitate DKN in collecting inputs to develop national FPIC mechanism for REDD+ implementation.



Provincial and district level consultations approach

- Bottom up approach

 Utilize as much as possible existing consultation processes



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- Conducted dissemination to key stakeholders at provincial level on UNREDD Programme (Provincial Planning Bureau, Forestry Province Office, NGOs).
- An FGD on consultation process to stakeholders at provincial level.
- Collaborate with an NGO focused on empowering Adat/traditional community (Bantaya) to develop a framework of applying FPIC at district and village communities.



Comments from ົ awe itial

- Distribute all UNREDD documents so that public will understand about REDD and UNREDD activities in Central Sulawesi. (Some NGOs voluntarily redistribute the documents to district governments).
- Conduct a multi stakeholder (including district governments and community) consultation meetings on implementation of UNREDD in central Sulawesi.
- Conduct a discussion on detailed plan of UNREDD activities in Central Sulawesi involving multi stakeholders and also communities



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- Conducted consultations with multistakeholders including representatives from province govt, district govts, NGOs, CSOs, professional association, and Adat communities to set priority of UNREDD activities →
 Meetings with Prov Govt, NGOs (May- Sept); FGD on 13 Oct 2010.
- Launching UN REDD Programme at Provincial Level inviting stakeholders representatives from province govts, district govts, NGOs, CSOs, professional association, Adat communities, UNDP, FAO, UNODC, MoFor, universities, privates.
- Establish a REDD+ Task Force and Working Group Purpose: to establish an institution responsible for REDD+ infrastructure in Central Sulawesi → in progress, it is planned it will formally be appointed with Governor decree (legal aspect)



Community level Consultation framework: FPIC on activities



- Central Sulawesi has high social conflict.
- Bottom Up approach, involve local players
- Conduct Technical discussions with NGOs and district government.
- Design FPIC framework.
- Small grant programs will be developed.







Community-level Consultations

Two main objectives:

- To raise awareness, receive inputs and provide a process of engagement for local stakeholders including local communities to indicate consent (or otherwise) for UN-REDD activities in their areas
- To pilot REDD related FPIC processes, build up experience and increase capacity and awareness of local communities and government to manage consultations in the future for "real" REDD programmes

- Small grant program will be developed to support dissemination of UNREDD activities and REDD+ in general to local communities.
