Thank you for submitting Pakistan's request to participate in the UN-REDD Programme. We are pleased to inform you that the UN-REDD Programme's Policy Board has agreed with Pakistan's request to participate in the UN-REDD Programme. Please allow me to detail what this participation entails.

Pakistan will have access to our online collaborative community of practice, receive sponsorship to attend regional training sessions and workshops were possible, and will be placed on the UN-REDD Programme's mailing list for key documents and information emerging from the Programme's body of work.

In addition, Pakistan may be invited to submit a funding request to receive funding for a National Programme in the future if selected through a set of criteria to prioritize funding for new countries approved by the Policy Board.

The UN-REDD Programme traditionally invites countries with the status of an observer, to participate in Policy Board meetings. Pakistan, as an observer, can attend these meetings but the Programme does not sponsor observers.

Pakistan will receive an invitation to the upcoming UN-REDD Policy Board meeting in Berlin, Germany and along with my colleagues in the UN Agencies we look forward to discussing our collaboration further
