### National REDD Readiness







- Management of Readiness
  - Institutional framework developed through a consultative process with stakeholders
- Forest Policy and Legislative Review
  - Aligns the forestry sector with national environmental goals
  - Takes into account new and emerging issues in the sector like climate change, trans-boundary forest resources, participatory approaches to forest management
- Stakeholder Engagement
  - Critical to ensure REDD works in Zambia

#### REDD Readiness Roadmap

- Outcome 1: Capacity to manage REDD Readiness strengthened
- Outcome 2: Broad based stakeholder support for REDD established
- Outcome 3: National governance framework and institutional capacities strengthened
- Outcome 4: REDD strategies identified
- Outcome 5: Capacity for capturing REDD elements in the national monitoring, reporting and verification system strengthened
- Outcome 6: Reference scenario of forest emissions established

# UN-REDD Zambia Programme (2)







#### Situation Analysis & Challenges:

- Capacity building within government departments to enhance integrated approach to forest and land management
- Continued stakeholder engagement in order to broaden views on REDD and consensus
- Establishing mechanisms for REDD implementation, including:
  - Defining a transparent benefit sharing model
  - Addressing the root causes of deforestation and forest degradation with appropriate activities that shift forest resource use patterns
  - Integration into long-term development strategies of the country

## National Readiness: Activities prior to COP15







- Submission of the UN-REDD Zambia Programme
  - Primary draft to be completed by 31 October
- Submission of the Forest Policy and Amended Forests Act to the Cabinet
- Strengthen the Readiness management arrangements
  - Across Ministries and Government
  - Through ongoing stakeholder engagement
