

# Safeguarding people and nature in REDD+






is a mechanism that creates a financial value for the carbon stored in forests by offering incentives for developing countries.


REDD+ stands for countries' efforts to reduce emissions from deforestation and forest degradation, foster conservation, sustainable management of forests, and enhancement of forest carbon stocks.



#### Why are the safeguards needed?

In reducing CO2 emissions by avoiding deforestation, REDD+ presents both benefits and risks to people and nature.








### **Safeguards**


are measures to protect or to avoid risks (do no harm), while promoting benefits (do good).

**Full and effective** participation of relevant stakeholders




Respect for the knowledge and rights of indigenous peoples and members of local communities
