Theory of breakthrough




From strength to strength - over a decade of capacity development and knowledge management

- Annual thematic priorities will guide all global outputs
- Linkages to, and leverage of, the knowledge of external partners
- > Outputs follow a knowledge journey and are connected, coherent and sequenced




